WELCOME

Mr P. Nhleko, Chairman of the JSE Board, welcomed attendees to the eighteenth Annual General Meeting (AGM) of the shareholders of JSE Limited (JSE), convened in accordance with the provisions of the Companies Act 2008, the JSE Listings Requirements and the JSE's Memorandum of Incorporation. This was the second AGM to be hosted through a hybrid approach both in-person and via a virtual platform, which enabled the widest possible participation by shareholders.

1. NOTICE OF MEETING

It was <u>NOTED</u> that the Notice of AGM and the 2023 Integrated Annual Report (incorporating the Director's Report, Audited Annual Financial Statements, Group Audit Committee report and the Auditor's Report) had been posted to shareholders on 28 March 2024. It was <u>AGREED</u> that the Notice of meeting be taken as read.

No additional matters were proposed by shareholders for inclusion on the AGM agenda.

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2. QUORUM

(In terms of section 64 of the Companies Act, 2008 and the JSE's Memorandum of Incorporation (MOI), a quorum for all Annual General Meetings shall be at least 25% of the total number of voting rights that are entitled to be exercised and at least three (3) shareholders entitled to vote, personally present)

The Chairman confirmed that The Meeting Specialist (Pty) Limited (TMS), the JSE's appointed scrutineer for this AGM, had confirmed that the requirements for a quorum had been met.

The Chairman declared that the necessary quorum was present and that the meeting was properly constituted.

3. SCRUTINEERS

It was **NOTED** that the JSE has appointed TMS, and specifically Mr Izzy van Schoor, as the scrutineer to manage the poll and ensure all votes are correctly recorded.

It was **NOTED** that the JSE's external auditors, Ernst & Young were also in attendance to exercise oversight.

4. BOARD MEMBERS IN ATTENDANCE

It was <u>NOTED</u> that members of the JSE Board were in attendance, including the chairmen of the JSE's Board Committees, namely -

- Dr Suresh Kana the JSE's Lead Independent Director and the Chairman of the Group Audit Committee and of the Group Sustainability Committee.
- Mr Ben Kruger Chairman of the Group Investment Committee
- Ms Faith Khanyile Chairman of the Group Remuneration Committee
- Mr Ian Kirk Chairman of the Group Risk Management Committee, and
- Ms Zarina Bassa Chairman of the Group SRO Oversight Committee.

The Chairman highlighted the Board renewal programme, in effect since 2015, through which the Board ensures that there is an appropriate balance of knowledge, skills, experience, diversity and independence represented on the Board.

The Chairman confirmed that the JSE has a clear policy on Board tenure, and that non-executives may serve for three terms of three years (nine years' service).

Ms Nolitha Fakude retired from the Board earlier this year, having served diligently for a consecutive term of six years as an independent non-executive director.

As part of a planned succession process, Ms Faith Khanyile joined the Group Remuneration Committee at the beginning of 2023 and succeeded Ms Fakude as Group Remuneration Committee Chairman in January 2024.



5. PRESENTATION OF 2023 INTEGRATED ANNUAL REPORT, GROUP'S CONSOLIDATED ANNUAL FINANCIAL STATEMENTS & SUPPLEMENTARY REPORTS

The Chairman tabled the following JSE reports which were **NOTED** at the meeting:

- Audited Consolidated Annual Financial Statements for the year ended 31 December 2023, including the Directors' Report, the Group Audit Committee's report and the Independent Auditor's Report;
- Integrated Annual Report 2023;
- Governance and Remuneration Report 2023; and
- Sustainability Report 2023.

It was **NOTED** that the reports are non-voting agenda items and serve to provide a comprehensive account of the various activities undertaken by the Group during the 2023 financial year.

6. SHAREHOLDER QUESTION AND ANSWER SESSION RELATING TO THE REPORTS AND AGM RESOLUTIONS

The Chairman confirmed that members of the JSE Board were in attendance and available to answer questions raised during the AGM. He invited questions from shareholders represented at the meeting on the JSE's Integrated Annual Report and/or any of the proposed AGM resolutions.

Shareholders raised general questions on the business of the JSE, which were addressed by the Chairman and CEO. The questions and answers are not recorded as part of these minutes however they can be accessed on the recorded video of the meeting as uploaded on the JSE's website.

The Chairman proceeded with the business of the AGM.

7. PRESENTATION OF AGM RESOLUTIONS AND VOTING

The Chairman presented the AGM resolutions, as contained in the Notice of AGM, for consideration by the shareholders. The resolutions deal with ordinary and special business and include the required advisory resolutions relating to the remuneration policy and the implementation thereof.

It was **NOTED** as per the terms of the Company's MOI, all resolutions would be voted by means of an electronic poll, rather than by a show of hands.

The Chairman advised shareholders that the online voting platform reflects all votes as automatically defaulted to "For" and reminded shareholders to select "For", "Against" or "Abstain" for each resolution.

Shareholders were reminded to check their selections carefully as these cannot be retracted or re-voted once submitted. Once a selection for each resolution has been made, shareholders should scroll down to the bottom of the page and click on "Submit". A message will pop up on the shareholder's screen confirming that the vote has been received.

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8. ORDINARY RESOLUTIONS NUMBERS 1 – 4

The Chairman advised the meeting that the ordinary resolutions would require the support of a simple majority of votes in order to be adopted.

ORDINARY RESOLUTION NUMBER 1

RE-ELECTION OF DIRECTORS RETIRING BY ROTATION (TRIENNIAL ROTATION) IN TERMS OF THE COMPANY'S MOI

It was <u>NOTED</u> that directors serve three-year terms and retire by rotation in accordance with the provisions of the JSE's MOI. Directors that are eligible, stand for re-election by shareholders.

The JSE's Group Nominations & Governance Committee has considered these proposed re-elections and has recommended that Mr Ian Kirk, Ms Faith Khanyile and Ms Zarina Bassa be re-elected as directors.

The Chairman proposed that these directors each be re-appointed with immediate effect for a further term, noting that each of these three re-elections is by means of a separate vote.

It was **NOTED** that a brief biography for each of these directors is contained in the notice of meeting.

- Ernst & Young Inc. be and is hereby reappointed with immediate effect as the independent registered auditors

- Mr Kuben Moodley be and is hereby appointed as the designated auditor for the ensuing year or until the next AGM, whichever is the later.

ORDINARY RESOLUTIONS NUMBER 3.1 TO 3.3:

ANNUAL ELECTION OF INDEPENDENT NON-EXECUTIVE DIRECTORS AS MEMBERS OF THE GROUP AUDIT COMMITTEE, EACH BY WAY OF SEPARATE VOTE

It was **NOTED** that –

- In terms of the Companies Act and the JSE's MOI, the JSE Board is proposing three independent non-executive members of the Board for election as members of the Group Audit Committee.
- The Group Audit Committee serves as the audit committee for JSE Limited and all Group entities.
- A brief biography for each director is contained in the notice of meeting.
- Each appointment is by way of a separate vote.

ORDINARY RESOLUTION NUMBER 3.1:

RE-ELECTION OF DR S.P. KANA AS A MEMBER AND CHAIRMAN OF THE GROUP AUDIT COMMITTEE

This motion was proposed and seconded –

That Dr S.P. Kana be and is hereby re-elected as a member and as Chairman of the Group Audit Committee with immediate effect.

10. SPECIAL RESOLUTIONS

The Chairman advised the meeting that the special resolutions would require the support of at least 75% of the total number of votes present in order to be adopted.

SPECIAL RESOLUTION NUMBER 1:

GENERAL AUTHORITY TO REPURCHASE SHARES IN TERMS OF SECTION 48 OF THE COMPANIES ACT

This motion was proposed and seconded -

That the Board of the Company are hereby authorised, by way of a renewable general authority, to approve the purchase of its own ordinary shares by the Company, or to approve the purchase of ordinary shares in the Company by any subsidiary of the Company, upon such terms and conditions as the Board of Directors of the Company may from time to time determine, provided that:

- The general repurchase of ordinary shares in the aggregate in any one financial year by the Company does not exceed 5% (five percent) of the Company's issued ordinary share capital as at the beginning of the financial year;
- The general repurchase of securities will be effected through the order book operated by the JSE trading system and done without any prior understanding or arrangement between the Company and the counterparty (reported trades are prohibited);
- Authorisation thereto has been given by the Company's memorandum of incorporation;
- This general authority shall only be valid until the Company's next annual general meeting, provided that it shall not extend beyond 15 (fifteen) months from the date of passing this Special Resolution;
- General repurchases may not be made at a price greater than 10% (ten percent) above the weighted average of the market value for the securities for the five business days immediately preceding the date on which the transaction is effected (the JSE should be consulted for a ruling if the applicant's securities have not traded in such five-day business day period);
- At any point in time, a Company may only appoint one agent to effect any repurchases on the Company's behalf;
- A resolution has been passed by the Board confirming that the Board has authorised the general repurchase, that the Company passed the solvency and liquidity test and that since the test was done there have been no material changes to the financial position of the Group;
- any such general repurchase will be subject to the applicable provisions of the Companies Act (including sections 114 and 115 to the extent that section 48(8) is applicable in relation to that particular repurchase);
- Any such general repurchases will be subject to exchange control regulations and approval at that point in time;





- The number of shares purchased and held by a subsidiary, or subsidiaries of the Company shall not exceed
 10% (ten percent) in aggregate of the number of issued shares in the Company at the relevant times;
- The Company or its subsidiary may not repurchase securities during a prohibited period as defined in the JSE Listings Requirements unless they have in place a repurchase programme where the dates and quantities of securities to be traded during the relevant period are fixed (not subject to any variation) and have been submitted to the JSE in writing prior to the commencement of the prohibited period; and
- When the Company has cumulatively repurchased 3% (three percent) of the initial number of the relevant class of securities, and for each 3% (three percent) in aggregate of the initial number of that class acquired thereafter, an announcement will be made in accordance with paragraph 11.27 of the JSE Listings Requirements.

Upon being put to the vote, the above motion was declared -

SPECIAL RESOLUTION NUMBER 2:

GENERAL AUTHORITY TO PROVIDE FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE TO SUBSIDIARIES AND OTHER RELATED AND INTER-RELATED ENTITIES IN TERMS OF SECTIONS 44 AND 45 OF THE COMPANIES ACT

This motion was proposed and seconded –

That the directors of the Company may, to the extent required by the Companies Act, and subject to compliance with the requirements of the Company's memorandum of incorporation and the JSE Listings Requirements (each as presently constituted and as amended from time to time), authorize the Company to provide direct or indirect financial assistance, including by way of loan, guarantee, the provision of security or otherwise, to any of its present or future subsidiaries and/or any other company or entity that is or becomes related or inter-related to the Company or any of its subsidiaries, and/or to any member of such subsidiary or related or inter-related company or entity, all as contemplated in Sections 44 and/or 45 of the Companies Act, for such amounts and on such terms and conditions as the directors of the Company may determine.

Upon being put to the vote, the above motion was declared -

SPECIAL RESOLUTION NUMBER 3:

SPECIFIC AUTHORITY TO PROVIDE FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE FOR LTTIS 2018 SCHEME IN TERMS OF SECTIONS 44 AND 45 OF THE COMPANIES ACT

This motion was proposed and seconded –

"Resolved that the Company and its subsidiaries be and are hereby authorised, in terms of sections 44 and 45 of the Companies Act, for a period of two years from the passing of this special resolution number 3, to provide direct and/or indirect financial assistance to the JSE LTIS 2018 Trust, and to the directors and prescribed officers of the Company or any of its subsidiaries participating in the LTIS 2018, for the purpose of and/or in



connection with the acquisition of ordinary shares of the Company from time to time or otherwise, as may be required for the operation and administration of the LTIS 2018, subject to the provisions of the Companies Act."

Upon being put to the vote, the above motion was declared –

SPECIAL RESOLUTION NUMBER 4:

PROPOSED NON-EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR EMOLUMENTS FOR 2024

This motion was proposed and seconded -

That the Company be and is hereby authorised, in terms of section 66(9) of the Companies Act, to pay emoluments, as set out on page 19 of the Notice, to its non-executive directors for their services as directors in respect of the period from 1 January 2024 to the date of the annual general meeting of the Company held during 2025, plus any value-added tax (VAT) to the extent applicable.

Upon being put to the vote, the above motion was declared –
